

New approaches to sustainable intensive forest management and their practical implementation within the forestry regulatory framework



Aim of study tour: To exchange best practices experiences of intensive forest management, that increase productivity and ensure sustainability within the forestry regulatory framework.

Overarching question: How can secondary forests be managed more productively and sustainably within the forestry regulatory framework?

Key underlying questions that will focus the study tour:

- 1. What barriers inhibit sustainable forest management intensification under the new forestry regulatory framework, and which solutions can enable it?
- 2. What is sustainable intensive forest management, and which innovative best practice examples demonstrate it?
- 3. What biodiversity conservation best practices could be applied within the framework of IFM?
- 4. What should an intensive forest management database consist of, and how could it be used for successful introduction of intensive forest management?
- 5. What could a 'Boreal Forest Academy' look like, and how would it work to develop a skilled workforce to increase productivity, but ensure sustainability?
